- → Trade policy shifts of major global players
 - Divergence from global rules-based trading system
- → EU response
 - WTO compatible unilateral and bilateral steps
- Czech interests in trade policy
 - Open
 - Secure
 - Diversified

Trade policy in geopolitically turbulent world

- Opennes may imply security vulnerabilities
- Market closure implies lack of innovation and lagging behind
- Subsidy schemes not effective in the long run

→ Open trading and investment environment with security safeguards

Mitigating risks in trade policy

- → Keeping secure investment environment
 - ▶ FDI screening
- → Reducing critical trade dependencies
 - Import / export
 - FTAs, sectoral agreements
- → Addressing tech leakage
 - Export controls
 - FDI screening
 - Trusted research

FDI Screening: Vulnerabilities

- critical infrastructure
 - large companies
 - in touch with state authorities
- emerging and disruptive technologies
 - undesired transfer of technology
 - EU definition of critical technologies: from AI to advanced materials
 - startups, spinoffs, SMEs
 - security mindset variable, deal pace rapid
 - Reccomendations on EDTs and investment screening
